

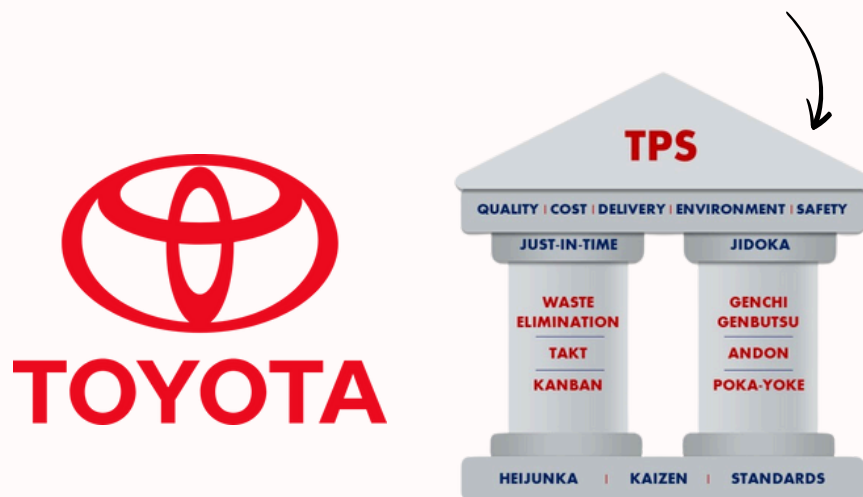

Enterprise Production Framework

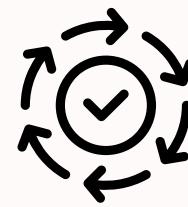
An Enterprise Production System (XPS) serves as an organizational framework aimed at standardizing and enhancing production processes within a company.

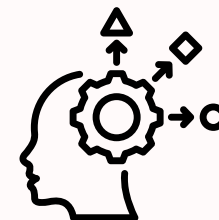


Strategic advantages
